- Report: Treasurer Betsy L. passed out the budget.

 - Chris J. asks everyone to look over the budget.

- Melane R.G asks how much we spent last year and what is the difference between last year's budget and this year's budget?
- Betsy L. stated that last year it was \$28,799 and we were able to get more accurate this year since we
 were tracking in real time. Total expenses were \$22,000 which did not include the money we donate to
 World Service.
- Melane R.G and Frank . asked what our income was from last year. Betsy L. stated that our income last year was \$21,830.
- Melanie R.G pointed out that we spent more than what we brought in last year and Betsy L. replies that is why we had to transfer from our savings.
- Frank P. asked if this is because we don't account for the contribution to World Service?
- Betsy L. said that does not account for the money that we donated to World since that is not technically an expense but we did have a beginning balance at the beginning of the year so we collect about 21, so we had to transfer about \$1500, \$2500, or \$3500 over from savings to checking, but now we have to get back on track we need to transfer about \$1250.
- Chris J. restates the motion the motion on the floor to approve the budget. Previously seconded. Passes unanimously.

- Steve C. explained that SR 14 stands for standing rule 14 which is one of the standing rules of CAWSO. Any referral that's put in to be presented at the conference must be submitted 120 days before the conference to the WSO. They then must submit it to the delegates 90 days before the conference to process and digest that information, bring it back to our groups, and get a group conscience on the issues that are going to be voted on. So, there's a lot of standing rules. This is probably the biggest and most used one in Cocaine Anonymous. Steve C. also mentioned that if any of the delegates currently have anything at all that they want to have submitted, now is the time to do it so it can get to those respective committees prior to the SR 14 deadline.
- Chris J. also mentioned that anyone and any member could submit a referral for any changes you want to see to
 literature or process pretty much anything.
